



This article describes the procedures and requirements of .jo domain names.

Registration

Registration takes up to 14 working days to complete once all the required documents and information has been provided.

Registration requirements: - A Power of Attorney duly notarized and legalized up to the Jordanian Consulate along with a copy of any registered trade mark which is identical to the domain name which is being requested are required.

Transfer

Domain name transfers are not allowed under the .jo extension. In order to transfer a domain name from one registrar to another you will be required to cancel the domain name registration in order re-register the domain under the management of new registrar.

Domain name transfer/re-registration takes up to 14 working days if all required documents have been provided.

Outgoing transfer

Domain name transfers are not allowed under the .jo extension. In order to transfer a domain name from one registrar to another you will be required to cancel the domain name registration in order re-register the domain under the management of new registrar.

Domain name transfer/re-registration takes up to 14 working days if all required documents have been provided.

Update

Owner change (trade)

Domain name ownership change are not allowed under the .jo extension. In order to transfer a domain name from one registrant to another you will be required to cancel the domain name registration in order to re-register it with the new details.

Other update

- whois update(s) for .jo domain name(s) takes up to 14 working days to complete at the registry.

Deletion / Restore

Delete

- Deletion requests for .jo domain name(s) takes up to 14 working days to complete.

Restore / reactivate

- An expired or issued for deletion .jo domain name(s) can be restored and there will be an additional charge for the restoration.

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Technical information

- DNSSEC support: no
- The domain name under (.jo) or any of its second-level can contain Latin letters (a – z), numbers (0 – 9) and dash “ – ”, provided that it cannot begin and end with a dash
- The selected domain name shall be identical or derived from the name of the registrant or its abbreviation, translation or any of trade marks without any shortage
- The domain name shall not begin with the formula “xn-” because this formula is for names that convert from non – Latin characters (Unicode) to Latin characters (ASCII)
- The variety of characters and numbers selected for a domain name shall not be consistent with common numbering and naming schemes. For example, the domain shall not be named “0xFF” because this number represents 255 with the hexadecimal numbering scheme
- The minimum domain name length shall be 3 characters and the maximum domain name length shall be 36 characters
- IDN support - No
- Registration period: 1 year
- Renewal date offset: 35 days
The number of days before the registry's expiration date, that Openprovider requires the domain to be renewed or expired. [More info.](#)
- *Note that the dates as shown in your Openprovider account are always leading, even if they do not match the renewal date offset mentioned here.*
- Soft quarantine period: n/a days
During this period, following after an expiration, the domain can be restored for free. This period does not apply if the domain is deleted explicitly. [More info.](#)
- Quarantine period: 0 days
During this period, an expired or deleted domain name can be reactivated at an additional fee.
