Registration

Successful domain registration via [RCP](#) or [XML API](#) or [REST API](#) requires:

- Two or more nameservers or a nameserver group
- For companies from Malaysia, business registration number and copy of business registration certificate is required.

Note: Trustee service is no longer required and therefore no longer available for second-level .my domains. Currently, the Trustee is only applicable to third-level extensions like .com.my.

Transfer

To start the transfer the user credentials of the registrant at the .my registry are required. After starting the registry will send an email to the registrant, requesting approval of the transfer.

Additional notes on a .my transfer

The domain holder has to confirm an email send from the registry (except for internal transfers).

Update

Owner change (trade)

Trade for .my are not possible.

Other update

You can update the contact information used for the domain name by updating the associated handles. Updating of the nameservers can take up to 14 days.

Deletion / Restore

Delete

You can let the domain name expire automatically at the end of its registration period or you can delete it manually.

Restore / reactivate

Restores for .my are not possible.
