This article describes the procedures and requirements of .to domain names.

Registration

Successful domain registration requires:

- two or more nameservers or a nameserver group

Transfer

- To transfer a domain name the current registrant must first create a [transfer key](#). The new registrant uses that key to re-register the domain in their name.
Domain name transfers are considered as new registrations.
- **DO NOT** give away your master password as a method of transferring domain names --- this will result in reassigning the registration of ALL of the domain names registered under that customer handle!
- If you have a transfer key for a domain name, go to www.tonic.to/transfersld.htm.
- upon successfully transferring a .to domain, it is automatically renewed for two years.
